Sexual _____ is a massive problem.

Definition of *sexual sin*: Any sexual behavior that is outside of what God intended between a man and a woman inside the context of marriage.

Run from sexual sin! No other sin so clearly affects the **body** as this one does. For sexual immorality is a sin against your own **body**.
