1. Criticism
"What does this bunch of poor, feeble Jews think they're doing? Do they think they can build the wall in a single day by just offering a few sacrifices? Do they actually think they can make something of stones from a rubbish heap - and charred ones at that?" Nehemiah 4:2
2. <b>Conflict</b> within the team
Miriam and Aaron criticized Moses because he had married a Cushite woman. They said, "Has the Lord spoken only through Moses? Hasn't he spoken through us, too?" <i>Numbers</i> 12:1-2
3. Lack of <u>motivation</u>
Then the people of Judah began to complain, "The workers are getting tired, and there is so much rubble to be moved. We will <b>never</b> be able to build the wall by ourselves." <i>Nehemiah 4:10</i>
4. <u>Crises</u> and <u>disasters</u>
5. Opposition
So Sanballat and Geshem sent a message asking me to meet them at one of the villages in the plain of Ono. But I realized they were plotting to harm me. Nehemiah 6:2
How can leaders stay the course?
Leaders must keep themselves fired up
And David was greatly distressed, for the people spoke of stoning him, because all the people were bitter in soul, each for his sons and daughters. But David <b>strengthened himself</b> in the Lord his God. 1 Samuel 30:6

### Introduction
