For Group Discussion

Answer these questions prior to your Small Group meeting this week.

Introduction

Based on research, most Americans are dissatisfied with their job. That's sad because we spend so much of our lives at work. Unfortunately, when we voice our dissatisfaction to others we often hear unhelpful advice like, "Suck it up! Welcome to the real world," or "Why don't you just quit?" What if there is another option? What if we could learn to love the job we have? What if we could change our perspective and recognize that work is a place where our faith can be demonstrated and developed? Then, maybe we could learn to love our jobs.

Discussion Questions

- 1. According to a recent Gallup poll, 70% of Americans hate or are completely disengaged in their jobs, and only 30% are engaged and satisfied. Why do you think this is so? Where do you fall? Why?
- 2. Read Proverbs 17:22. One way to begin finding joy at work is to get prepared with a great morning routine. In the space below, write out the steps of your normal morning routine. Share with the group why you do what you do as you prepare to start your day.

Do you notice anything in your normal morning routine that hinders you from preparing well for the day ahead? What's missing from your routine that would help you prepare to give your best? What would you have to do to change your routine?

3. Read Psalm 147:12-14. The Bible often references God's provision in protecting and feeding His people, which led Martin Luther to the conclusion that God distributes His favor and blessing through the work we do. Tell the group about the work you do, and then let the group reflect to you why and how the work you do adds value to our lives.

4. Read Colossians 3:17 & 23. Your job is the place and the means of your discipleship to Jesus. How do your faith and work-life interact? How can the difficulties, challenges, and stresses you experience at work help shape your faith? Share some opportunities you have to more effectively represent Jesus
