FOR GROUP DISCUSSION

Answer these questions prior to your Small Group meeting this week.

1. How we handle our money impacts every part of our lives. It is a huge factor in marriage, a tremendous responsibility in parenting, and a potential landmine for singles. Of the 5 ideas Danny and Jackie discussed about finances, which one resonated with you most? Why?

MARRIEDS – How have your individual views on finances affected your marriage? What can you do (or have you done) to get on the same page with your financial decisions?

SINGLES – After hearing the stresses that money can cause in a marriage, what can you do to safeguard your future marriage from financial pressures?

2. READ Colossians 3:13. Danny mentioned 3 reasons it is sometimes difficult to forgive – it feels like you're letting someone off the hook, you think they will just do it again, and/or sometimes the other person does not seem remorseful.

MARRIEDS – When it comes to marriage, two sinful people (with all their faults) are pledging to live together for the rest of their lives. What are some of the things this type of pledge requires from each person? When it comes to your spouse, what has been the most common reason it is difficult to forgive?

SINGLES & MARRIEDS – READ 1 Peter 4:8. How would your current relationships (marriage) look if you began to think the best of others (your spouse) before the bitterness of an unforgiving position springs up? How would your willingness to forgive others (your spouse) change if you began to consider how God has forgiven you?

3. Danny and Jackie gave us 4 principles they have discovered to help them 'fight fair'. How does 'active listening' diffuse a tense situation? What does it mean to 'consider the temperament' of the other person? Why is this important? How do you know if it is a 'good time' or a 'bad time' to begin taking on a situation with a potential conflict? What kinds of things can you do to help alleviate your anger so that you stay cool and calm when conflict arises?

READ John 10:10. How can you create reminders of who the real enemy is, and what his intentions are for you, in order to bring perspective to the conflicts in your relationships?

4. MARRIEDS – What is the biggest challenge you face in your marriage? What are some questions you should be asking your spouse and yourself to evaluate the condition of your marriage? What will you do this week to intentionally address the things that are harmful to your emotional, physical, and spiritual connection as husband and wife?

SINGLES - How can implementing the principles you've heard in this series effect your current relationships and your potential marriage relationship in the future?
