

# WEEK 2 HELP OTHERS USING YOUR GIFTS MATT RANDALL

The role of the Holy Spirit is to <u>nudge</u> us.

For all who are **led** by the Spirit of God are children of God. *Romans 8:14*

The Holy Spirit will nudge you to <u>invest</u> <u>in</u> <u>others</u> by using your gifts .

God has given each of you a **gift** from his great variety of spiritual gifts. Use them well to **serve one another**. 1 Peter 4:10

For you have been called to live in freedom, my brothers and sisters. But don't use your freedom to satisfy your sinful nature. Instead, use your freedom to serve one another in love. *Galatians* 5:13

People are <u>eternal</u>.

"You are a never-ceasing spiritual being with an eternal destiny in God's great universe." –Dallas Willard

Share each other's **burdens**, and in this way obey the law of Christ. *Galatians* 6:2

We know that **real love** is because Jesus gave up his life for us. So we also ought to give up our lives for our brothers and sisters. 1 John 3:16

The same love that Jesus carried on the cross is what the Holy Spirit carries inside us.

- 1. <u>Discover</u> your gift.
- 2. Start planning to bless others.

## **Group Prep**

In preparation for small group, read 1 Corinthians 12:1-11, then answer the following discussion questions.

#### Introduction

Each of us has been gifted in different ways, and it is our responsibility to use the unique gifts God has given us to bless and serve others well. When we follow the nudge of the Holy Spirit to use these gifts, we open ourselves to receiving the blessings of the abundant life God calls us to.

### **Discussion Questions**

1. How do you enjoy spending your time, what are you good at, and how would you say you've been gifted?

2. In 1 Corinthians 12:4-6, Paul discusses the diversity of gifts among believers. Explain the point Paul is trying to make and how is it applicable to Emmanuel? Using the passage in 1 Corinthians 12 and your own experience, make a list of the many different ways God can gift the people of His church to bless one another.

Here are three ways we can begin to invest in others by using the different ways God has gifted us:

Discover your gift – Think of the different people in your group and jot down what different talents and gifts are present. If anyone in this group is having trouble determining how they've been gifted, in what ways can we determine how God has designed us to be a blessing to others?

Start planning to bless others – Read 1 Peter 4:10. How can you create space in your schedule, or margin in your budget, to bless others?

Do something - What ways are you currently serving others with the gifts God has given you? How could this group use the different gifts represented to bless each other, partner with the church, and advance the Kingdom of God?

3. Is there anything that keeps you from investing in others by using the different ways God has gifted you? Read 1 John 3:16-18. What happens in us when we allow the Holy Spirit to work through us to bless others?
